ORDER REVOKING FOREIGN CERTIFICATE

By Order 2009-5-3, issued May 1, 2009, we revoked the Section 41102 certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing Skybus Airlines, Inc. (“Skybus”), to engage in interstate scheduled air transportation of persons, property, and mail.

By this order, we are revoking the company’s companion foreign scheduled certificate. Instead of repeating our findings and conclusion in Order 2009-5-3, we incorporate them here by reference.

ACCORDINGLY, pursuant to authority assigned by the Department in its regulations, 14 CFR 385.12:

1. We revoke the certificate of public convenience and necessity issued to Skybus Airlines, Inc., by Order 2006-5-9, authorizing it to engage in foreign scheduled air transportation of persons, property, and mail.
2. Unless disapproved by the President of the United States under section 41307 of Title 49 of the United States Code, this order shall become effective on the 61st day after its submission for section 41307 review or upon the date of receipt of advice from the President or his designee under Executive Order 12597 and implementing regulations that he or she does not intend to disapprove the Department’s order under that section, whichever occurs earlier.¹
3. We will serve a copy of this order on the persons listed in Attachment A.

¹ This order was submitted for review under 49 U.S.C. §41307 on May 1, 2009. The 61st day is July 1, 2009. Since the President’s designee did not disapprove this Order before that date it became effective on July 1, 2009.

Persons entitled to petition the Department for review of this order under the Department's Regulations, 14 CFR 385.30, may file their petitions within 10 days of the service date of this order.

This order is effective immediately and the filing of a petition for review shall not alter its effectiveness.
